Mathematics

We will begin with looking at numbers to 20, followed by understanding place value using a variety of apparatus. We will be partitioning numbers to 100 and estimating where numbers are placed on a number-line. We will move on to addition and subtraction before finishing with shape.

We will also be carrying on with our daily Mastering Number sessions where the children will practise their skills of number and patterns.

All of Owl Class will have login details for Maths Whizz. We will practise this in school and you will be able to access this at home.

R.E

What does it mean to belong to a faith community?
We will start off with talking about other groups we belong to.

Music

The children will take part in weekly Music sessions where they will get the opportunity to explore a range of musical techniques, listen and dance to music and sing songs relating to the rainforest and jungles.

Science

Healthy me! - Looking at what is needed to be healthy. Focusing on hand washing, brushing teeth, exercise and a varied diet

New life - During this unit, we will look at growing up, animal life cycles and the basic needs of animals.

English

In writing we are going to be looking at a range of character descriptions and building up a bank of adjectives that we like. Lots of role play will take place to get an idea of who the character is. We will then write our own character descriptions.

We will also be learning about Poetry - looking at a range of poems about 'Our Wonderful World' and discussing the language/imagery/pattern/rhyme. We will use this to create our own poems based on the theme.

In reading we are focusing on Revolting Rhymes (Poetry) and The Julian Stories (Diverse) to develop our reading skills and continue to promote a love of reading and books. We continue to have daily ERIC sessions as well as individual reading.

Geography

Why is my world wonderful? Looking at simple world maps and discussing the features - continents, oceans, mountains and rivers.

History

Why are some places special? We will be looking at significant places in our own locality and thinking about their historical significance.

Computing systems and networks – IT around us Creating media – Digital photography.

Gymnastics
